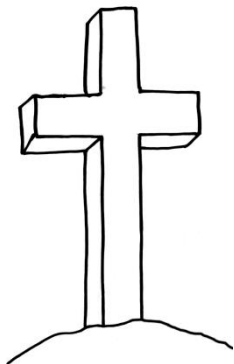

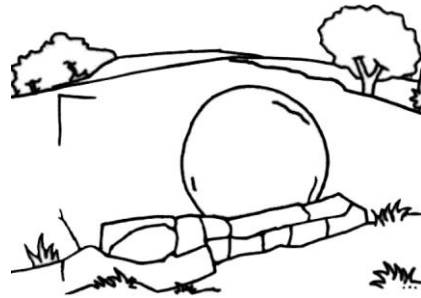

An activity to do if you like:

Have you ever heard of a book without words? It is a book with coloured pages only. The colours are black, red, white, gold (yellow) and green.

Black – this stands for the sin or wrong that we do which needs to be forgiven by God.

Red – these wrong things we do can be forgiven because Jesus died for us. Red represents His blood.

White – when we are forgiven it is just like we have been washed very clean.

Gold (or yellow) – this stands for heaven. If we trust in Jesus to save us, our sins are forgiven and we will go to be with Him in heaven when we die.

Green – this stands for growing as a Christian by reading the Bible and praying.

To make the book without words you will need: coloured cardboard or coloured paper in black, red, white, gold (or yellow) and green. You will also need a hole puncher and two pieces of ribbon or wool (any colour).

Measure one 10cm by 8cm rectangle for each of these colours: black, red, white and gold (or yellow). Then measure two green 10cm by 8cm rectangles – this is for the front and back of the little book. Cut out the rectangles, then place in this order: green at the front, followed by black, red, white, gold (or yellow) and green at the back.

Ask an adult to help you punch two holes on one of the long sides of each rectangle. Thread the ribbon or wool through the holes and tie securely, but not tightly, leaving room to turn the pages. Now your wordless book is ready to help you remember what Jesus did for us.
