TPTL has just completed printing 20,000 Gospels for both Malawi and Mozambique, and the response has been overwhelming, as schools, prisons, churches, and communities alike have shown a strong hunger for receiving God's Word. In Balaka, one woman gratefully exclaimed, "At last we have something to read called the Bible!" Bishop Banda similarly notes that evangelists now go out with renewed confidence, knowing they can hand people their own copy of the Gospel.

Despite personal challenges, including caring for a father-in-law who recently suffered a stroke, Andrew, TPTL's representative for Malawi, remains unwavering in his service. He has partnered with evangelists from different denominations to distribute Gospels far and wide, including the Dzaleka Refugee Camp, where even the smallest gift of Scripture can bring immense hope. TPTL celebrates what God is doing through Andrew's faithfulness and our supporters' generosity. Every Gospel placed in someone's hands offers a chance to encounter Jesus. With traditional Bibles prohibitively expensive for many, these locally printed Gospels provide vital access to God's Word.

We are delighted to share highlights from our Christmas Evangelistic Outreach Campaign, which ran from November 2024 to January 2025. Young people from local churches, students from Bible colleges in Bangkok and beyond, and overseas mission teams all joined us in spreading the Good News.
